The Parish Council of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the Governing Authority of the Parish of Iberia by Mr. Jerome Fitch, its Chairman, who announced that the Council was now ready to conduct its business.

## PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL:

1. Mr. Troy Courville and Mr. Art Nixon, representatives of Kolder, Champagne, Slaven and Company, were not present to address the Council to present the financial audit for fiscal year ending December 31, 2009. This item will be delayed until the next Council meeting.
2. Mr. Tim Jack, representing the Disabled Veterans Outreach Program, addressed the Council to provide information on the services their program provides to veterans through Louisiana Workforce Commission.

Mrs. Carol Gros addressed the Council to express appreciation of her family for the Council's adoption of Resolution No. 2009-127 which requests authorization by the Louisiana Department of Transportation to name the US 90 Overpass at LA 675 as the "George T. ## PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL: (Continued...)

4. Senator Troy Hebert addressed the Council regarding various infrastructure improvements projects and related grants. Senator Hebert proposed various projects, with funding to be provided in a mix of State and Federal grants with local matching funds. Senator Hebert stressed that he feels that the Council should include the Acadiana Regional Airport Access Highway Project (LA 3212 Extension to U.S. Highway 90) within the Recovery Proposal Program in connection with the Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery Program through the Parish-implemented Recovery Program. The first phase of this project is expected to cost approximately \$3 million and would serve as a direct access to the Acadiana Regional Airport. Senator Hebert suggested that, if the Council would consider appropriating \$1 million or more towards this project, from the \$11 million grant for the Recovery Program funds, he would urge the Iberia Parish Legislative Delegation and the Louisiana Legislature to match these local funds to provide the total funding for this much-needed economic development project. During the discussion regarding this matter, the Council agreed that they would consider appropriation of \$1.5 million from the \$11 million grant for the ARA Access Highway Project, if the Senator would be successful in obtaining matching funds in the amount of \$1.5 million from the Louisiana Capital Outlay Budget to complete the funding for this project. Questions were raised regarding this highway and whether it would be considered an extension of a State highway or if it would be considered a Parish road for future maintenance purposes. During the discussion regarding this project, Mr. Mike Tarantino, representing the Iberia Economic Development Authority, explained that this project is being planned in phases and that several grant sources are being considered for development of funding for the full project as quickly as possible. The various phases include the basic highway construction, underground lighting, gateway signage for ARA, etc.

Also discussed was the Parish's application for funding in the amount of \$2 million for the Bayou Portage Project, which is to be shared with St. Martin Parish Government at a rate of \$3 million and which project will provide drainage assistance to a very large area, including St. Martin Parish. All are in agreement that this is a very beneficial program.

Senator Hebert also stated that the Parish currently has \$3.3 million allocated for Housing Elevation within the \$11 million grant. The Parish has taken a position that no other projects would take place until all housing elevation projects are completed, but Senator Hebert stressed that the Iberia Parish Council should designate a specific amount for Housing Elevation Program and then should proceed with all other projects as soon as possible. He explained that it will take some time to develop guidelines and accept applications for the Housing Elevation Program and further that he feels that the Council should designate a specific dollar amount for this project, in order that all other projects may proceed as quickly as possible.

Also discussed was the proposed project to construct a retail store for the Delcambre Economic Recovery Program and all of the remaining questions regarding ownership of the retail facility, how the funds would assist the Town of Delcambre and whether the grant funds can be used for this purpose. Senator Hebert stated that he has discussed with the Iberia Parish Legislative Delegation changing this project from the proposed \$3.3 million retail store to a \$1 million allocation to be used to elevate the property which is to be used for the construction of a retail facility to the proper base flood elevation in order that the property will not flood and would be eligible for flood insurance coverage.

Senator Hebert also addressed his concern for the construction of sewerage improvements from the City of New Iberia's plant down U.S. Highway 90 in an effort to increase economic development. The Senator discussed efforts by the City and the Parish to work together for the development of a Waste Water Treatment Plant for the Acadiana Regional Airport area, but that the negotiations have fallen through since the Parish determined that it could operate the facility at a cost lower than that offered by the City of New Iberia. The Parish is currently waiting on the release of \$2.9 million in State Capital Outlay Funds which will complete the funding for this project. The Senator suggested that the Council, which recently requested the rededication of approximately \$500,000 in Capital Outlay Funding from various projects to be used for the Sugar Cane Festival Building and for the Pepperplex, may want to reconsider the possible rededication of these funds to be used towards local matching funds for these proposed sewerage improvements. Senator Hebert stated that he could then possibly request the State to allocate an additional \$500,000 to match these funds for the construction of sewerage improvements along U.S. 90. He stated that water improvements have recently been constructed along U.S. 90 toward the Coteau area and the addition of sewerage improvements would greatly enhance the opportunity for economic development of the U.S. 90 corridor. The Chairman stated that the Senator's request regarding the possible rededication of the \$500,000 would be taken under advisement.

Also, during the discussion, several points were made regarding the allocation of the State's Visitor Enterprise Funds which are typically distributed to the Tourist Commission, the Acadiana Fairgrounds and other agencies involved in the promotion of Iberia Parish. The Council is considering a Resolution which would request that the Iberia Parish Legislative Delegation provide an established formula for the distribution of these funds in order that the Tourist Commission, the Fairgrounds, etc. could have more stable budget projections throughout each year.

Also discussed by the Senator was the proposed revisions he had made to a request by the Council for the naming of the U.S. 90 Overpass at LA 675 in honor of former Council member George T. Gros. Senator Hebert has proposed naming the Jefferson Street bridge in Mr. Gros' honor, which proposal has been opposed by several members of the Council and by Mr. Gros's family. Mrs. Carol Gros, Mr. Gros's widow was present, and she again expressed her opposition to the naming of the

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bridge in her husband's honor instead of naming of the overpass as the Council had originally requested.

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-175

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2009-250, DATED SEPTEMBER 23, 2009, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF THE RECOVERY PROPOSAL FORM IN CONNECTION WITH THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM THROUGH THE PARISH-IMPLEMENTED RECOVERY PROGRAM IN ORDER TO REVISE THE PROJECTS TO BE INCLUDED WITHIN SAID PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Government is scheduled to receive Disaster Recovery funds under the Community Development Block Grant Parish-Implemented Recovery Program in response to Hurricanes Gustav and Ike; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Recovery Authority and the Louisiana Disaster Recovery Unit are requiring that the Parishes submit a Recovery Proposal Form; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Government held two (2) public hearings at different locations in the Parish to obtain citizens input on this Recovery Proposal Form along with a meeting of the Mayors of the municipalities to obtain their input; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Government has developed the Recovery Proposal Form and desires to submit the Recovery Proposal Form for approval to the State of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Council adopted Resolution No. 2009-250, dated September 23, 2009, which Resolution designated the specific projects and estimated funding for each project to be included within said program; and

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WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Government has reconsidered the list of projects to be included within said program and has determined that several revisions should be made to said list, including the addition of specific projects, the elimination of specific projects and revisions to existing projects; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Council is interested in including a proposed project for the LA 3212 Extension to U.S. Highway 90, which would serve as a direct access to the Acadiana Regional Airport and provide necessary infrastructure for the economic development of said area, which project is estimated to cost approximately \$3 million, with the Iberia Parish Government to dedicate \$1.5 million of Disaster Recovery Program Funds and a proposed request for Louisiana Capital Outlay Funds in the amount of \$1.5 million to complete the necessary funding for said project; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Council has reconsidered its planned application for grant funding for the Delcambre Economic Recovery Project to revise the project from a grant of \$3 million for the construction of a retail store/mall establishment to include an application for grant funds in the amount of \$1 million to be used to elevate a large parcel of property to the proper base flood elevation levels for said property to be used for the future construction of a proposed retail store/mall establishment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Iberia Parish Council does hereby amend Resolution No. 2009-250, dated September 23, 2009, to revise, approve and submit the Revised Recovery Proposal Form for Iberia Parish, as follows:

- A. Housing Rehabilitation (Owner-Occupied and Rental Elevations) - \$6,480,502;
- B. Infrastructure/Economic Development:
  - (1) Delcambre Property Elevation for Economic Recovery - \$1,000,000;
  - (2) Bayou Du Portage (T-Bayou) Drainage Improvements (Funding to be coordinated with funding with St. Martin Parish Government) - \$2,000,000;
  - (3) Acadiana Regional Airport Highway Access Project (Funding to be matched with Louisiana Capital Outlay Funding) - \$1,500,000
  - (4) Potential for some of the funds remaining from the Housing Rehabilitation/Elevation Project included within this program (as listed in Item #A above) to be used and dedicated for the New Iberia Armenco Drainage Canal Project.
- C. Economic Development: no plan to utilize these funds for this purpose.
- D. Coastal Restoration: no plan to utilize these funds for this purpose.
- E. Program Administration: \$55,000

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Iberia Parish Council that the Parish President of Iberia Parish, Mr. Ernest Freyou is hereby authorized to sign and submit the REVISED Recovery Proposal Forms to the Louisiana Recovery Authority under the Community Development Block Grant Parish-Implemented Recovery Program.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the Iberia Parish Council and approval by the Parish President in accordance with Section 2-13 of the Iberia Parish Home Rule Charter.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2010-06-4212

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 24-156 OF THE IBERIA PARISH ZONING ORDINANCE, ENTITLED "ABANDONMENT OF A NON-CONFORMING USE", SO AS TO FURTHER CLARIFY THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE ABANDONMENT PERIOD FOR A NON-CONFORMING USE OR STRUCTURE, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH STANDING COMMITTEE ITEM #2010-05-B OF MAY 12, 2010.

THAT THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. Section 24-156 of the Iberia Parish Zoning Ordinance addresses commencement of the abandonment period for non-conforming uses or non-conforming structures.
- SECTION 2. Concerns have been raised that commencement of the abandonment period does not adequately address existing mortgages, leases, encumbrances, etc. that may have an impact of the property owners' right of possession.
- SECTION 3. Further elaboration of Section 24-156 was recommended to address all aspects of ownership and abandonment of non-conforming uses or non-conforming structures.
- SECTION 4. The Iberia Parish Regional Zoning Commission requested appropriate language to address any outstanding concerns.
- SECTION 5. The Iberia Regional Zoning Commission received the additional language and properly noticed the public and conducted the appropriate public hearing.
- SECTION 6. That Section 24-156 is hereby amended to include the following:
1. If the lessee of any building or place used or occupied for non-conforming purposes under a bona fide lease, shall at any time before expiration of said lease, cease to occupy or use the building for non-conforming purposes, the building or land shall not be considered vacant until the owner of the building or land shall again obtain legal control of its occupancy and use. This exemption shall not apply if the lessor, for any reason, is entitled legally to regain possession and does not attempt to do so by legal or other effective means.
  2. In the event of bankruptcy a building or place used for non-conforming purposes shall not be considered vacant until said building or place is sold or possession thereof returned to the owner by order of court or otherwise in the bankruptcy proceedings.

3. Any building or land used for non-conforming commercial or industrial purposes upon which a mortgage has been inscribed and recorded shall not be considered vacant after foreclosure proceeding have been instituted until mortgagee or purchaser, at foreclosure sale, takes possession and ownership is established by court procedure or until mortgagee gains possession of the property by a recorded legal transfer.

SECTION 7. That Section 24-156 of the Iberia Parish Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to include the provisions contained herein.

SECTION 8. That this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the Iberia Parish Council and approval by the Parish President in accordance with Section 2-13 of the Iberia Parish Home Rule Charter.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2010-06-4213

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE/CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW A COMMUNICATION TOWER ON PROPERTY OWNED BY THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND DEVELOPMENT LOCATED AT THE SOUTHWEST INTERSECTION OF U.S. HIGHWAY 90 AND LA 85, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH STANDING COMMITTEE ITEM #2010-05-C OF MAY 12, 2010.

THAT THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. The La. Department of Transportation and Development is requesting a Special Use/Conditional Use Permit for the installation of a communication tower on their property located at the southwest intersection of US Highway 90/LA Highway 85.
- SECTION 2. The property is currently zoned Agricultural (A-1), and, a communication tower is allowed as a Special Use/Conditional Use Permit.
- SECTION 3. The Zoning Ordinance establishes the process for requesting a Special Use/Conditional Use.
- SECTION 4. The property owner and authorized agent have satisfied all requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.

A RESOLUTION URGING PRESIDENT OBAMA TO REDUCE THE SIX-MONTH MORATORIUM ON DEEP-WATER DRILLING IN THE GULF TO NO MORE THAN THIRTY (30) DAYS, AND DURING THAT TIME TASK MINERALS MANAGEMENT SERVICE (MMS) WITH CONDUCTING THOROUGH INSPECTIONS OF ALL DEEP-WATER DRILLING FACILITIES IN THE GULF AS WELL AS IMPLEMENT STRICT SAFETY MEASURES AND TAKE ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH SAFETY MANDATES, THUS GREATLY REDUCING THE JOB LOSS AND NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACT FELT BY OUR REGION WHILE ENSURING A SAFER INDUSTRY.

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of the British Petroleum (BP) Oil Spill, on May 27, 2010, the Obama Administration ordered a six month moratorium on existing Gulf of Mexico deep-water drilling, which will result in the immediate suspension of operations at thirty-three (33) rigs in the Gulf of Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the moratorium on offshore deep-water drilling will cause significant harm to Louisiana's energy service industry as well as to the many coastal communities already suffering tremendously from the environmental and economic impacts of the BP oil spill; and

WHEREAS, an estimated thirty-three per cent (33%) of the nation's domestic oil comes from the Gulf of Mexico; and

WHEREAS, eighty percent (80%) of the oil and forty-five per cent (45%) of the natural gas coming out of the Gulf of Mexico is from deep-water drilling operations in more than 1,000 feet of water.

WHEREAS, suspension of deep-water drilling operations will result in at least 33 deep-water drilling rigs being idled for six months or longer; and

WHEREAS, Port Fourchon located in Lafourche Parish services ninety per cent (90%) of deep-water operations in the Gulf of Mexico.

WHEREAS, an average of two (2) supply boats work each rig per day with rates of \$15,000 - \$30,000/boat. Suspension of drilling activity will result in a nearly \$1 million loss per day in just supply boat rental income; and

WHEREAS, each drilling rig averages 180-280 employees for each two-week shift, and each job supports four other jobs in our local communities. Thus, the suspension of drilling activity will result in a loss of up to 6,000 jobs in two to three weeks, and more than 20,000 Louisiana jobs over the next 18 months.

WHEREAS, Louisiana coastal communities such as Houma, Morgan City and Lafayette are home to businesses, from welders and divers to caterers and drivers, that support the offshore oil and gas industry, with 1 in 3 jobs being related to the industry; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that each exploration and production job represents four supporting jobs in and around the region, thus a six-month moratorium will result in the loss of thousands of jobs and millions of dollars in wages; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana coastal communities will begin experiencing severe and irreversible economic impacts within thirty (30) days of the moratorium; and

WHEREAS, idle drilling rigs in the Gulf will likely be contracted overseas for work in other locations such as Africa and Brazil, and may not return to the Gulf of Mexico for several years, greatly extending the BP Oil Spill induced economic crisis for our state; and

WHEREAS, it is unlikely that deep-water work in the Gulf would resume quickly even after the moratorium is lifted, given the time and expense involved in relocating rigs; and

WHEREAS, several of the safety recommendations set forth in the Department of Interior's May 27, 2010 *Increased Safety Measures for Energy Development on the Outer Continental Shelf* can be implemented immediately within the next thirty (30) days including MMS verification of the safety of the (1) MMS certification of the safety of the BOP stacks, (2) MMS verification of BOP equipment compatibility (3) development and implementation of new inspection procedures and reporting requirements, (4) establishment of new fluid displacement procedures, and (5) verification of compliance with existing regulations and National Safety Alert requirements; and

WHEREAS, other measures set forth in the Department of Interior's May 27, 2010 *Increased Safety Measures for Energy Development on the Outer Continental Shelf* such as those requiring emergency rule making along with the National Commission on the BP Deep-water Horizon Spill and Offshore Drilling investigation can be conducted simultaneously with the continued operations of offshore deep-water drilling; and

WHEREAS, MMS could, and should, maintain a full-time presence on all ongoing deep-water drilling locations, with a 7-10 day

rotation schedule and enforce that strict compliance with API standards be maintained on all equipment used in well construction; and

WHEREAS, any failure in compliance should mandate immediate closure of the offending rig, rather a complete shut down of all deep-water drilling operations which would unjustly punish those companies that have provided this country's energy needs while operating safely and in compliance with all regulations, as well as those coastal communities already facing an economic crisis as a result of this being the most challenging economic periods in decades coupled with the devastating economic impacts of the BP oil spill on the fishing, tourism and ancillary industries; and

WHEREAS, the last thing the Gulf Coast area needs is a public policy that will certainly destroy thousands of existing jobs while preventing the creation of thousands more; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Iberia Parish, Louisiana acting as governing authority of said Parish:

SECTION 1. A resolution urging President Obama to lift the six-month moratorium on deep-water drilling, and instead conduct a thorough review of all deep-water drilling facilities, implement and enforce strict safety measures to ensure compliance with safety mandates.

SECTION 2. Further, let it be resolved that, while we support efforts to make the offshore deep-water drilling industry safer, we urge President Obama to reduce the six-month moratorium on deep-water drilling in the Gulf to no more than thirty (30) days, and during that time task Minerals Management Service (MMS) with conducting thorough inspections of all deep-water drilling facilities in the Gulf as well as implement strict safety measures and take enforcement actions to ensure compliance with safety mandates, thus greatly reducing the job loss and negative economic impact felt by our region while ensuring a safer industry.

SECTION 3. That the Parish Clerk forward a certified copy of said resolution to Governor Bobby Jindal and all members of the Iberia Parish Legislative Delegation.

## COUNCIL MEMBERS/PRESIDENT ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. Mr. Curtis Boudoin questioned the status of the enforcement of the nuisance ordinance and was advised that cars parked along a public street are not considered a nuisance, but can be towed if they are causing hazards to traffic.
2. Mr. Larry Richard had a special instance within his district which would make it hard for a resident to have debris collection for the next several months because of the way he works offshore and due to the implementation of the current schedule. Public Works Director Kevin Hagerich advised that the Parish Barn has a site which can be used to dispose of debris and also that the Parish's c & d landfill is opened on Saturdays to accommodate those who cannot make the debris collection schedule.
