IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council of Iberia Parish, Louisiana met in Regular Session in the Parish Council Chambers, Main Courthouse Building, New Iberia, Louisiana, on Wednesday, June 22, 2011.

The Parish Council of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the Governing Authority of the Parish of Iberia by Mr. Roger Duncan, its Chairman, who announced that the Council was now ready to conduct its business.

**PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL:**

1. Ms. Shelley Greer-Hebert, Executive Director of Keep Iberia Parish Beautiful, addressed the Council to provide a quarterly report to present the district by district litter index results. However, Ms. Greer-Hebert requested that she be allowed to postpone this presentation until a future meeting. She explained that they had conducted two litter walks recently, one in Jeanerette and one in Loreauville. She pointed out that school students in the Loreauville will continue to sponsor litter walks. In addition, she has visited several of the middle schools to promote the "Waste in its Place" program.

Ms. Greer-Hebert pointed out that persons needing to complete community service hours can contact her and she will assist them in meeting them while helping Iberia Parish become beautiful.

A motion was made by Ms. Maggie F. Daniels, seconded by Mr. Lloyd Brown, that the Iberia Parish Council does hereby recess its Regular Session and convene as a Public Hearing to obtain public comments regarding Ordinances and Resolutions being considered for final adoption.

This motion having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:

And the motion was declared adopted this 22nd day of June, 2011.

Mr. Jimmy Landry spoke in opposition of Summary No. 4300, which is a reclassification for lots in Sugarhill Estates Subdivision, pointing out that the Parish held several public hearings during the process of implementing a zoning plan for the Parish and the public had the opportunity, at those meetings, to make changes to classifications prior to the zoning plan being adopted by the Parish. Mr. Landry pointed out that this item has been to the Council several times and he would support a C-1 classification but could not support a C-2 classification.

Mr. Naray Hulin pointed out that this is not the first time a reclassification request has come before the Council and it won't be the last. Mr. Hulin pointed out these types of situations will come up from time to time.

Upon questioning, Legal Counsel Eric Duplantis pointed out that the two front lots of said subdivision were excluded from the restrictions of the subdivision; therefore, they could be used for commercial development. Mr. Duplantis further stated that he feels that should the Council deny this request, it would be a difficult

to defend such a case.

Several residents of Sugarhill Estates also spoke in opposition of the reclassification request, including Mr. Clyde Olivier, Ms. Ramona Verret (who distributed comparison photographs of C-1 and C-2 buildings), Ms. Sonya Williams, and Mr. Ray Gary.

Mr. Lloyd Brown stated that he would be abstaining from voting on this matter as his daughter was a resident of this subdivision. Mr. Brown stated that he had received verbal approval to participate in voting on this item from the Ethics Commission; however, he would prefer to wait until he has something in writing from them before voting on said matter. Legal Counsel Eric Duplantis commented Mr. Brown on his efforts to obtaining options regarding his vote in this matter.

Mr. Troy Comeaux pointed out that there are other businesses located along La. 88 near this site. Mr. Comeaux also pointed out that a Sonic Drive Inn is located at the entrance to College Park Subdivision; however, the Sonic is conducive to businesses located along Admiral Doyle Drive.

Mr. John Mouton, Legal Counsel of the developer, pointed out that the exiting bank, Teche Bank and Trust, was one of the businesses to locate near this development. Mr. Mouton agreed that there are already several businesses located along La. 88 near this site. Mr. Mouton pointed out that they have made amendments to the original plans to appease the residents and stated that the use of this property is consistent with the neighborhood.

Upon hearing no further comments, a motion was made by Ms. Maggie F. Daniels, seconded by Mr. Troy Comeaux, that the Iberia Parish Council does hereby adjourn its Public Hearing and reconvene into Regular Session.

AN ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING THE PROPERTY OF DOYLE COPELL AND DON ROMERO, LOCATED AT THE INTERSECTION OF CENTER STREET AND CURTIS LANE, FROM AGRICULTURAL (A-1) TO GENERAL BUSINESS (C-2), LOCATED IN DISTRICT 5.

THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2009-02-4099, adopted February 25, 2009, established the Zoning Regulations for rural Iberia Parish and is recorded in the Official Records of Iberia Parish at COB, Page 65.
- SECTION 2. At that time the Zoning Ordinance and Map was adopted the area shown on the attached map and described herein was zoned Agricultural (A-1) even though the site was in use selling mini warehouses and is located on a major element of the transportation network.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Permitting, Planning and Zoning received a request to reclassify the property of Doyle Copell and Don Romero located at the intersection of Center Street and Curtis Lane from Agricultural (A-1) to General Business (C-2).
- SECTION 4. The property is now considered non-conforming which prohibits further expansion or increase in square footage or cubical content, although the facility is allowed to continue in operation without penalty.
- SECTION 5. The property owners, Doyle Copell and Don Romero, are requesting reclassification of the site so that the property can be sold for the construction of a single bay self service car wash with access on Center St.
- SECTION 6. The property owner has filed the appropriate zoning reclassification application.
- SECTION 7. The Iberia Parish Regional Zoning Commission has duly advertised and notified appropriate property owners and the general public of the reclassification request.
- SECTION 8. The Iberia Parish Regional Zoning Commission conducted a Public Hearing on May 19, 2011.
- SECTION 9. The Iberia Parish Regional Zoning Commission after accepting all public input, deliberation on their part, and proper motion and second did recommend reclassification of the site from Agricultural (A-1) to General Business (C-2) for the following reasons as well as though enunciated in the Staff Report:

- (a) The site is currently in use selling mini warehouses, a commercial operation.
- (b) The site is requesting reclassification now to facilitate the sale of the property for construction of a single bay self serve car wash.
- (c) The surrounding property is zoned Agricultural, however, the majority of zoning in the area is commercial.
- (d) The site is inappropriate as Agriculture but is appropriate as a General Business area, and the proposed use will not adversely affect the neighborhood to the rear.
- (e) At the Public Hearing there was no opposition expressed by any of attendees.
- (f) Reclassification of the site will provide and encourage continued commercial development of the community.

SECTION 10. That the Iberia Parish Council does now hereby ordain that the property of Doyle Copell and Don Romero located at the intersection of Center Street and Curtis Lane be reclassified from Agricultural to General Business.

AN ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING THE PROPERTY OF MARK D. MARTIN, LOCATED AT 7105 HWY. 90 EAST, FROM AGRICULTURAL (A-1) TO GENERAL BUSINESS (C-2), LOCATED IN DISTRICT 12.

THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2009-02-4099, adopted February 25, 2009, established the Zoning Regulations for rural Iberia Parish and is recorded in the Official Records of Iberia Parish at COB, Page 65.
- SECTION 2. At that time the Zoning Ordinance and Map was adopted the area shown on the attached map and described herein was zoned Agricultural (A-1) even though the site was in use as storage facility for boats, recreational vehicles, and miscellaneous storage items.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Permitting, Planning and Zoning received a request to reclassify the property of Mark D. Martin located at 7105 HWY 90 EAST from Agricultural (A-1) to General Business (C-2).

AN ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING THE PROPERTY OF MARK D. MARTIN, LOCATED AT 6806 HWY. 90 EAST FROM MIXED RESIDENTIAL (R-2) TO GENERAL BUSINESS (C-2), LOCATED IN DISTRICT 12.

THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2009-02-4099, adopted February 25, 2009, established the Zoning Regulations for rural Iberia Parish and is recorded in the Official Records of Iberia Parish at COB, Page 65.
- SECTION 2. At that time the Zoning Ordinance and Map was adopted the area shown on the attached map and described herein was zoned Mixed Residential (R-2) even though the site was in use as mechanic/repair shop for large farm equipments and implements.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Permitting, Planning and Zoning received a request to reclassify the property of Mark D. Martin located at 6806 HWY 90 EAST from Mixed Residential (R-2) to General Business (C-2).
- SECTION 4. The property is now considered non-conforming which prohibits further expansion or increase in square footage or cubical content, although the facility is allowed to continue in operation without penalty.

AN ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING LOT 1 BLOCK 1 OF SUGARHILL ESTATE, LOCATED AT THE NORTHEASTERN CORNER OF SUGARHILL DRIVE AND LA HWY 88 (COTEAU ROAD) INTERSECTION, FROM MIXED RESIDENTIAL (R-2) TO NEIGHBORHOOD SHOPPING DISTRICT (C-1), SPECIAL USE/CONDITIONAL USE, TO INCLUDE A WAIVER OF MAXIMUM BUILDING SQUARE FOOTAGE, LOCATED IN DISTRICT 14.

THAT THE IBERIA PARISH COUNCIL DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2009-02-4099, adopted February 25, 2009, established zoning regulations for rural Iberia Parish and is recorded in the Official Records of Iberia Parish at COB 1430, Page 65.
- SECTION 2. At the time that the Zoning Ordinance and Map was adopted the area shown on the attached map and described above was included in a Mixed Residential (R-2) zone as the property was vacant.
- SECTION 3. The property is currently vacant; however, the lots in SugarHill Estates along HWY 88 were excluded from the Residential Restrictive Covenants for Sugar Hills Estate, Inc. Phase 1, recorded in 1998.
- SECTION 4. In order to market and develop the property commercial, the property owner applied for reclassification from Mixed Residential (R-2) to Neighborhood Shopping District (C-1).
- SECTION 5. The Zoning Commission accepted the application for reclassification and in accordance with LA Enabling Legislation did provide proper notice to all appropriate parties and did provide proper general advertisement and did conduct Public Hearings to receive public input on the reclassification request; and, after due deliberation did recommend denial of the reclassification request from Mixed Residential (R-2) to Neighborhood Shopping District (C-1) as the Commission considered the Neighborhood Shopping District obtrusive to the neighborhood and the proposed size of the building was too great.
- SECTION 6. The Iberia Parish Council after accepting all public input, deliberation on their part, and proper motion and second does hereby override the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and further authorizes the reclassification of said property from Mixed Residential (R-1) to Neighborhood Shopping District (C-1), and further does hereby grant a Special Use/Conditional Use, to include a waiver of maximum building square footage, located in District 14.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2011 RECREATION DISTRICT NO. 8 FUND BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$95,020 FOR AIR CONDITIONING OF THE KING JOSEPH BUILDING LOBBY, GYM, BALLROOM, AND KITCHEN AND FOR TELESCOPIC BLEACHERS, ALL TO BE FUNDED FIRST FROM THE 2011 RECREATION DISTRICT NO. 8 FUND BUDGET - FUND BALANCE, PREVIOUS YEARS AND THE 2011 ROYALTY FUND BUDGET, ROAD IMPROVEMENTS RESERVE LINE ITEM AND FURTHER REQUESTING THE RECREATION DISTRICT NO. 1 BOARD TO CONSIDER REIMBURSEMENT OF FUNDING FROM THE ROYALTY FUND BUDGET FOR THE BALANCE OF THIS PROJECT AND A PREVIOUS APPROPRIATION OF \$73,129 FOR PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENTS AT THE RECREATION DISTRICT NO. 8 BUILDING.

WHEREAS, by the adoption of Resolution No. 2010-319, dated, November 3, 2010, the Iberia Parish Council agreed that any remaining funding available within the Recreation District No. 8 Fund following completion of the Recreation District No. 8 Building would be dedicated for improvements at the King Joseph Building; and

WHEREAS, various improvements for the King Joseph Building include air conditioning of the lobby, gym, ballroom and kitchen and the purchase of telescopic bleachers, all of which is estimated to cost approximately \$95,020; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the Recreation District No. 8 Building Renovations Project, the 2011 Fund will include a remaining balance of approximately \$87,000; and

WHEREAS, in order to complete the funding for the improvements at the King Joseph Building, additional funding is necessary from the 2011 Royalty Fund Budget, Road Improvements Reserve Line Item, in the approximate amount of \$8,020; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Council has requested that the Iberia Parish Recreation District No. 1 Board consider the reimbursement of funds to the Parish's Royalty Fund in the approximate amount of \$8,020 for the completion of the King Joseph Recreation Center Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, the Iberia Parish Council has also requested that the Iberia Parish Recreation District No. 1 Board consider the reimbursement of funds to the Parish's Royalty Fund in the amount of \$73,129 for the Recreation District No. 8 Center's Parking Lot Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Iberia Parish Council does hereby amend the 2011 Recreation District No. 8 Fund Budget in the amount of \$95,020 for air conditioning for the King Joseph Building lobby, gym, ballroom, and kitchen and for telescopic bleachers, all to be funded first from the 2011 Recreation District No. 8 Fund Budget, Fund Balance - Previous Years and the 2011 Royalty Fund Budget, Road Improvements Reserve Line Item, as follows:

SECTION 1. Election Call. Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission, and under the authority conferred by Article VII, Section 21(K) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, the applicable provisions of Chapter 5, Chapter 6-A and Chapter 6-B of the Louisiana Election Code, and other

constitutional and statutory authority, a special election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the Parish on **SATURDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2011**, between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m., and eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541, and at the said election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and laws of this State and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to-wit:

DISABLED VETERANS HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

SUMMARY: AUTHORIZES AN ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION IN THE PARISH OF IBERIA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, FOR CERTAIN DISABLED VETERANS AND SURVIVING SPOUSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH AND SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE VII, SECTION 21(K) OF THE LOUISIANA CONSTITUTION.

SHALL AN ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION BE AUTHORIZED IN THE PARISH OF IBERIA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, FOR CERTAIN DISABLED VETERANS AND SURVIVING SPOUSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH AND SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE VII, SECTION 21(K) OF THE LOUISIANA CONSTITUTION, PROVIDED THAT THIS ADDITIONAL HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION SHALL EXTEND AND APPLY TO PROPERTY IN IBERIA PARISH ONLY AFTER APPROVAL BY A MAJORITY OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS OF IBERIA PARISH VOTING ON THIS PROPOSITION?

SECTION 2. Publication of Notice of Election. A Notice of Special Election shall be published in the *Daily Iberian*, a newspaper of general circulation within the Parish, published in New Iberia, Louisiana, and being the official journal of the Parish, once a week for four consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date of the election, which Notice shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference the same as if it were set forth herein in full.

SECTION 3. Canvass. This Governing Authority shall meet at its regular meeting place, the Council Chambers, New Iberia, Louisiana, on **WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 2011, at SIX O'CLOCK (6:00) P.M.**, and shall then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the said special election.

SECTION 4. Polling Places. The polling places set forth in the aforesaid Notice of Special Election are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election, and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, will be the same persons as those designated in accordance with law.

SECTION 5. Election Commissioners; Voting Machines. The officers designated to serve as Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section 4 hereof, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1287, shall hold the said special election as herein provided, and shall make due returns of said election for the meeting of the Governing Authority to be held on Wednesday,

November 9, 2011, as provided in Section 3 hereof. All registered voters in the Parish will be entitled to vote at the special election, and voting machines shall be used.

SECTION 6. Authorization of Officers. The Clerk of the Governing Authority is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish to said election officers in ample time for the holding of said election, the necessary equipment, forms and other paraphernalia essential to the proper holding of said election and the Chairman and/or Clerk of the Governing Authority are further authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by State and/or Federal law to arrange for the election, including but not limited to, appropriate submission to the Federal Department of Justice under Section 5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

SECTION 7. Furnishing Election Call to Election Officials. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and *Ex-Officio* Parish Custodian of Voting Machines of Iberia Parish and the Registrar of Voters of Iberia Parish, as notification of the special election, in order that each may prepare for said election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 8. Application to State Bond Commission. Application is made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authority to hold the special election as herein provided. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of this Governing Authority, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of this application.

Chief Administrative Officer Sally Angers advised that she would advise Mr. Richard of same. Mr. Richard requested that he be advised of all meetings regarding this matter.
3. Legal Counsel Eric Duplantis commended Mr. Lloyd Brown and Mr. Jerome Fitch for their research to determine if they were able to vote on specific items in order that they vote appropriately during this meeting.
4. Mr. Charles Williams announced that this would be his last meeting as the District 12 representative on the Iberia Parish Council, serving for three years and seven months. Mr. Williams stated that he has enjoyed serving on the Council

and thanked members for their support of him during this time. Chairman Roger Duncan thanked Mr. Williams for his service to Iberia Parish as the District 12 representative.
