#### PARISH PRESIDENT ANNOUNCEMENTS

- President Richard informed the Iberia Parish Council that there were 8 participants in the Litter Abatement Program on Saturday, April 12, 2025. A total of 76 bags of trash and other items were collected in the areas of L. Theriot Road and Grand Prairie Road.
- President Richard informed the Iberia Parish Council that the Public Works Department completed several tasks during the period of April  $9^{\rm th}$  -22 $^{\rm nd}$ , 2025, including culvert cleaning and repairs, tree trimming, debris pickup, road patching, repairs and grating, sidebooming of front ditches, as well as many other tasks.
- President Richard gave an update on the Road Project and explained that a bond in the amount of \$17,000,000 was secured to complete Road Projects A, B, and C as a result of the road tax passed. He further stated that there are currently 38 roads being bid out at this time.
- President Richard also announced that bids will be accepted for roadway improvements of David Berard Road and Unifab Road, located in the TIF District. He further stated that Iberia Parish Council previously granted \$750,000 for road for road construction in the TIF District.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 2025-77

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF MAY 2025 AS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH IN IBERIA PARISH.

WHEREAS, this year's theme, "Turn Awareness into Action" encourages individuals to take meaningful steps towards improving their own well-being to lead a full and productive lives.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF LOUISIANA THROUGH THE COASTAL PROTECTION AND RESTORATION AUTHORITY (CPRA) AND IBERIA PARISH GOVERNMENT REGARDING CONSTRUCTION OF THE RUTTEN RILL ROAD WATER CONTROL STRUCTURE PROJECT (TV-0094) TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF; AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (" Agreement"), is entered into and effective by and between the State of Louisiana through the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "CPRA") acting by and through the Executive Director, Glenn Ledet Jr., and the Iberia Parish Government (hereinafter referred to as the "IPG" ) represented by its duly authorized Parish President M. Larry Richard (the CPRA and IPG are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" or individually as "Party").

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution provides, in part, that "(f) or a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions . . . may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other ..."; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to La. R.S. 49:214.5.2(A)(1), the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority Board (the "BOARD") represents the State of Louisiana's position relative to the protection, conservation, enhancement, and restoration of the coastal area of the state through oversight of integrated coastal protection projects and programs and at La. R.S. 49:214.5.2.(A)(7), the BOARD has the power and authority to enter into any contract with any political subdivision of the state for the study, planning, engineering, design, construction, operation, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of any integrated coastal protection project and to this end, may contract for the acceptance of any grant of money upon the terms and conditions, including and requirement of matching the grants in whole or part, which may be necessary; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to La. R.S. 49:214.6.1, the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority ("CPRA") is the implementation and enforcement arm of the BOARD and is directed by the policy set by the BOARD, and pursuant to La. R.S. 49:214.6.2 and La. R.S. 49:214.6.3, CPRA shall administer the programs of the BOARD and shall implement projects relative to the protection, conservation, enhancement, and restoration of the coastal area of the State of Louisiana through oversight of integrated coastal projects and programs consistent with the legislative intent as expressed in La. R.S. 49:214.1, and, therefore, the BOARD directs CPRA to administer and implement the obligations undertaken by the BOARD pursuant to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the IPG is the governing body of Iberia Parish, with the authority of a local political subdivision to enter into agreements with governmental bodies, such as the BOARD and/or CPRA, for the public welfare, health, safety, and good order of Iberia Parish by virtue of the specific authority granted in its Home Rule Charter and Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the IPG is authorized under La. Const. Article VI, Part III, of the Louisiana Constitution to provide for the construction and maintenance of levees, levee drainage, flood

protection, and hurricane flood protection within the territorial jurisdiction of the IPG, and all purposes incidental thereto, including on its own behalf or for the areas or the levee districts under its authority; and

WHEREAS, under La. Const. Article VI, Part III, the construction, maintenance, and care and inspection of levees, and all other things incidental thereto, within the jurisdiction of the numerous levee districts and levee authorizes established by Louisiana law shall devolve on the levee districts and levee authorities and the boards of commissioners of the respective levee districts and levee authorities; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of lessening the threat of harm citizens and damage to property in Iberia Parish through the reduction of flooding, by constructing the Rutten Rill Water Control Structure Project ("Project" or "Rutten Rill Water Control Structure Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project is an integrated coastal protection project eligible for funding under Section 105 the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) Act of 2006 (Title I of Division C of Public Law 109-432; 43 U.S.C. 1331 et seq.; 120 Stat. 3000), 30 C.F.R. Part 1219, Louisiana Constitution Article VII, Sections 9(B), 10.1 and 10.2, and La. R.S. 49:214.5.4(E); and

WHEREAS, the Project is consistent with the State's 2023 Coastal Master Plan and Fiscal Year 2025 Annual Plan, and is identified as eligible for allocation of proposed GOMESA funding, contingent upon funding being made available to the CPRA for the Project; and

WHEREAS, during the construction phase, the CPRA and IPG will mutually develop a specific operation, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation and replacement (OMRR&R) plan for the Rutten Rill Water Control Structure Project; and

WHEREAS, IPG will be responsible for 100% of the OMRR&R of the Stumpy Bayou Water Control Structure Project, but plans to enter into cooperative agreements or other sub-agreements in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana with other local sponsors for the performance of IPG's OMRR&R obligations under this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, IPG will be responsible for the construction administration, supervision and inspection, and quality assurance (QA) services, project management support during construction and design engineering services during construction of the Rutten Rill Water Control Structure Project, and these costs are payable by CPRA under this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement will be mutually beneficial to the Parties in the furtherance of their respective statutory purpose, duties, and authorities, and each Party expects to receive a public benefit least equal to the costs of the responsibilities undertaken pursuant hereto; and

WHEREAS, the CPRA and IPG, in connection with this Agreement, desire to foster a partnering strategy and a working relationship between the Parties through a mutually developed formal strategy of commitment and communication embodied herein, which creates an environment where trust and teamwork prevent disputes, foster a cooperative bond between the Parties, and to facilitate the successful implementation of the Project as described herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Parties' mutual undertakings herein and the purpose, duties, and authorities granted under La. R.S. 49:214.1 et seq., the constitution and general laws of the State of Louisiana.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the Iberia Parish Council and approval by the Parish President in accordance with Section 2-13 of the Iberia Parish Home Rule Charter.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF LOUISIANA THROUGH THE COASTAL PROTECTION AND RESTORATION AUTHORITY (CPRA) AND IBERIA PARISH GOVERNMENT REGARDING CONSTRUCTION OF THE STUMPY BAYOU WATER CONTROL STRUCTURE PROJECT (TV-0095) TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF; AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (" Agreement"), is entered into and effective by and between the State of Louisiana through the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "CPRA") acting by and through the Executive Director, Glenn Ledet Jr., and the Iberia Parish Government (hereinafter referred to as the "IPG") represented by its duly authorized Parish President M. WHEREAS, under La. Const. WHEREAS, the Project is consistent with the State's 2023 Coastal Master Plan and Fiscal Year 2025 Annual Plan, and is identified as eligible for allocation of proposed GOMESA funding, contingent upon funding being made available to the CPRA for the Project; and

WHEREAS, during the construction phase, the CPRA and IPG will mutually develop a specific operation, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation and replacement (OMRR&R) plan for the Stumpy Bayou Water Control Structure Project; and

WHEREAS, IPG will be responsible for 100% of the OMRR&R of the Stumpy Bayou Water Control Structure Project, but plans to enter into cooperative agreements or other sub-agreements in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana with other local sponsors for the performance of IPG's OMRR&R obligations under this Agreement; and
