

PROCEEDINGS FROM THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SEWERAGE DISTRICT No. 1 OF IBERIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, TAKEN AT A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2026.

The Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 of Iberia Parish, Louisiana, met in Regular Session at the Iberia Parish Sewerage District No. 1 office, 2617 Northside Road on Tuesday, February 24, 2026 , at four o'clock p.m.

Gage Guidry called the meeting to order with the following members present: Gage Guidry, Eddie Chretien, William Labauve, and Larry Darby, Jr.

Also, present were Chandler Staples, Staples Engineering, Darius Colar, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, and Scott Landry, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC.

It was moved by Chretien, seconded by Labauve, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 does hereby approve the minutes taken at the Regular Meeting held on January 27th, 2026 .

This motion having been submitted to a vote; the vote thereon was as follows:

And the motion was declared adopted on this the 24th day of February 2026.

A report was given by Scott Landry of Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, on the operation and maintenance of Plant 3 for the month of February 2026. Preventative maintenance was performed in several areas of the plant, including the digesters, blowers, EPW pumps and motors, Clarifier #2 gearbox and motor, mechanical bar screen, and bridge aerators. CCC #1 was drained and rinsed. CL2 and SO2 ejectors and regulators were cleaned. Preparatory dirt work began on the new chlorine building, measurements for the mechanical bar screen, auger system, and clarifier internals as part of the Tete Bayou WWP improvements project. A total of three hundred thirteen thousand five hundred (313,500) gallons of water was wasted from January 21 through February 18, 2026.

A report from Darius Colar with Statewide Electrical Services, LLC was reviewed for the month of February 2026 for the operation and maintenance of the District's field. All work for the month consisted primarily of routine operations and maintenance, including repairs at lift stations. Lakewood Lift Station had check valves, gate valves, fittings, and hardware replaced; Candleglow Lift Station had a broken 8-inch sewer force main repaired. Arco Lift Station had a broken blower air hose repaired, and Vida Shaw Lift Station had a second pump installed with all wiring checked. The vacuum truck was used at Lakewood and Turner lift stations.

A report from Staples Engineering: Progress on the Hwy 90 project is approximately 50% complete; however, the project is still on track for a May completion date. One thousand feet of force main was installed for the UL Lift Station relocation project. GIS mapping of manholes will resume.

The Director gave his report: There has been limited activity on policy and procedure. As part of the Water Sector Program, the lift station at Oil Center is installed, Breaux Estates is expected to start in mid-March, and Plant 3 upgrades are underway but experiencing long lead times for bar screen and clarifier materials, with more progress expected in May or June. The Beau Fleur chlorination chamber has been replaced, and Orange Grove is awaiting pumps and electrical.

Having no other business, it was moved by Chretien, seconded by Labauve, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 does hereby adjourn.
