

PROCEEDINGS FROM THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SEWERAGE DISTRICT No. 1 OF IBERIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, TAKEN AT A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 27, 2026.

The Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 of Iberia Parish, Louisiana, met in Regular Session at the Iberia Parish Sewerage District No. 1 office, 2617 Northside Road on Tuesday, January 27, 2026 , at four o'clock p.m.

Gage Guidry called the meeting to order with the following members present: Gage Guidry, Eddie Chretien, William Labauve, Sy Bodin, and Larry Darby, Jr.

Also, present were Chandler Staples, Staples Engineering, Darius Colar, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, and Scott Landry, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC.

It was moved by Chretien, seconded by Bodin, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 does hereby approve the minutes taken at the Regular Meeting held on December 23rd, 2025 .

This motion having been submitted to a vote; the vote thereon was as follows:

And the motion was declared adopted on this the 27th day of January 2026.

A report was given by Scott Landry of Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, on the operation and maintenance of Plant 3 for the month of January 2026. Preventative maintenance was performed in several areas of the plant, including the digesters, blowers, EPW pumps and motors, Clarifier #2 gearbox and motor, mechanical bar screen, and bridge aerators. CCC #2 was drained and rinsed. Preparatory work began on the new chlorine building. Four hundred thirty-eight thousand (438,000) gallons of sludge were wasted from December 17, 2026 through January 21, 2026.

A report from Darius Colar with Statewide Electrical Services, LLC was reviewed for the month of January 2026 for the operation and maintenance of the District's field. All work for the month consisted primarily of routine operations and maintenance, including repair of a sewer line at the Port of Iberia (Red Guard), repair of a damaged force main outside of the wet well at the State Farm Lift Station, installation of a new Liberty pump at 5217 East Old Spanish Trail, and repair of a 6-inch gravity line at 3900 Bayou Boulevard. The vacuum truck was used at the new sewer plant for Coteau Elementary, New Horizon and Breaux Estates package plants, State Farm and Lakewood lift stations, and the Turner Lift Station at the Port of Iberia.

A report from Staples Engineering: Progress on the Hwy 90 project was slow in December and remains approximately 40% complete; however, the project is still on track for a May completion date. Work has commenced on the UL project, including fencing and gate installation, with materials currently on site. This project is scheduled for six months, with an anticipated completion in June.

The Director gave his report: The FY 2025 budget was finalized in December. The subdivision project for Orange Grove, Breaux Estates, Beau Fleur, and Oil Center is ongoing and remains on track. Orange Grove is nearing completion, with manholes installed and sewer lines relined; the remaining work includes installation of pumps for the rear portion of the system. Breaux Estates will receive a new treatment plant, with that phase expected to begin in March. Construction of the Plant No. 3 chlorination building has commenced, and measurements are being taken for the installation of a new bar screen. The FY 2026 budget was fully approved, and funds are currently being utilized as allocated. The District also received a \$600,000 grant through FP&C.

Having no other business, it was moved by Darby, seconded by Labauve, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 does hereby adjourn.
