

PROCEEDINGS FROM THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SEWERAGE DISTRICT NO. 1 OF IBERIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, TAKEN AT A REGULAR MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, MAY 26, 2026

The Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 of Iberia Parish, Louisiana, met in Regular Session at the Iberia Parish Sewerage District No. 1 office, 2617 Northside Road, on Tuesday, May 26, 2026, at four o'clock p.m.

Gage Guidry called the meeting to order with the following members present: Gage Guidry, Eddie Chretien, Sy Bodin, and Larry Darby, Jr.

Also, present were Chandler Staples, Staples Engineering; Scott Landry, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC; and Darius Colar, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC.

It was moved by Chretien, seconded by Bodin, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 does hereby approve the minutes taken at the Regular Meeting held on April 28, 2026.

This motion having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:

A report from Scott Landry, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, was presented regarding the operation and maintenance of Plant No. 3 for the month of May 2026. Preventative maintenance was performed on digester blowers, EPW pumps and motors, Clarifier No. 2 gearbox and motor, mechanical bar screen, and bridge aerators. Water levels in the pond remain below the aerator anchor. CL₂ and SO₂ ejectors and regulators were cleaned. CCC Nos. 1 and 2 were drained and rinsed, and vegetation was removed from the inner walls. A total of 225,000 gallons were wasted between April 23, 2026, and May 20, 2026. The EPW tank was drained and cleaned and was opened for inspection.

A report from Darius Colar, Statewide Electrical Services, LLC, was presented regarding the operation and maintenance of the District's field for the month of May 2026. Work for the month consisted primarily of routine operations and maintenance. At the American Tank Lift Station, electrical issues were troubleshot, a new pump was installed, wiring connections were completed, and voltage, amperage, and rotation were tested. The station was returned to operating condition. At the Thibodeaux Trailer Park Lift Station, one of the blowers was found to be inoperable and the necessary repairs were completed. At the Michelle Lane Lift Station, a new pump and hose were installed, wiring connections were completed and tested for voltage, amperage, and rotation, the on/off float was adjusted after being hung up, and a broken force main was excavated and repaired, returning the station to operating order. At the ARA Main Station, the mixer was pulled, cleaned, and debris was removed from around the blades. The pump truck was utilized at Thibodeaux Mobile Home Park, C'est La Place Lift Station, the Neco Town Lift Station, and the American Tank Lift Station.

A report from Staples Engineering was presented regarding the District's construction and engineering projects for the month of May 2026. Work on the ULL Lift Station relocation project resumed in May following delays associated with required background checks. The project is anticipated to be completed by mid-June 2026. GIS mapping efforts continued during the month, with 10 manholes completed. The engineer also met with Amy to discuss additional equipment that would allow the District to track assets beyond manholes. The Hwy 90 project is approximately 85% complete. A change order has been drawn up to expand the project to the north side of Hwy 90.

The Director gave his report. He reported that a Water Sector Project meeting for the subdivision projects was scheduled for May 27. The remaining pumps are expected to have arrived, and work continues to move forward. The Orange Grove and Oil Center projects are expected to be completed by the end of June. Materials for the wastewater treatment plant chlorine building are now on site, and a meeting with Southern Constructors and Domingue & Szabo was scheduled for June 1. Hurricane preparedness efforts have begun with field crews checking generators and preparing Plant 3 for the upcoming season. The Director also reported that Domingue & Szabo was awarded the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for engineering services for the new wastewater treatment plant.

It was moved by Darby, seconded by Bodin, that the Board of Supervisors of Sewerage District No. 1 table consideration of a resolution authorizing the Executive Director to install a private treatment system at 205 Lucky Lane, allowing disconnection from the public sewer system, until the next regular meeting. The Board requested a legal opinion regarding whether the District may fund the installation of the private treatment system at 205 Lucky Lane and whether the existing public sewer infrastructure on Lucky Lane may be formally abandoned. The Board also requested clarification on how any future development or occupancy of the currently abandoned properties on Lucky Lane would be affected if the sewer infrastructure is abandoned.

This motion having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:
